MASTER PROGRAMMES

With a worldwide reputation for excellence, our Master programmes are designed for students who seek a rigorous education in world affairs. Taught by our eminent faculty, the small classes and seminars facilitate dynamic interaction

between professors, lecturers and students. A prestigious network of partner institutions allows Master students to spend a semester abroad in Asia, Europe or North America.

Our **two interdisciplinary Master programmes** offer students a dynamic and global approach to international and development issues.

INCENTIVES

Scholarships, Awards and Assistantships

Each year the Graduate Institute awards up to 200 scholarships for Master and PhD students on the basis of merit and need. They are given for one year and can be renewed subject to academic results and financial situation. In addition, students who produce an outstanding Master's or PhD thesis may see their research published or receive an academic award.

Teaching and research assistant positions are available to students, particularly PhD candidates, either within their own academic unit or in one of the Institute's research centres and programmes. A variety of short and long-term auxiliary staff positions are offered throughout the year.

DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

The mission of the Graduate Institute is to provide rigorous and independent research and education on world affairs in a way that respects diversity, develops creative thinking and fosters global responsibility.

Admissions

Admission to the Graduate Institute is based on a rigorous selection process in which candidates are assessed according to intellectual aptitude, cultural awareness and commitment

to confronting the major challenges of our times. Applications are processed from February through March for the following autumn.

To be eligible for a Master or PhD programme, candidates must meet the following criteria:

- Master applicants must hold a Bachelor's degree, or international equivalent, in a relevant discipline or field
- PhD applicants must hold a Master's degree, or international equivalent, in a relevant discipline or field
- All non-native English speaking candidates must have English language proficiency
- At least passive knowledge of French is an advantage (intensive French courses are provided during the first year for those who do not speak French)
- Submit a GRE (for Economics programmes applicants)
- Submit a thesis proposal (for PhD applicants)
