We would like to invite you to participate in the Forest Landscape Governance Research Network (EXPLORE) Regional Inception Workshop on 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> April 2021, from 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM ICT. The workshop will be held online through video conferencing using the Zoom platform.

The overall goal of the EXPLORE program is to support governments and civil society in using high-quality research results to improve policies, institutional frameworks and dialogues for more inclusive and sustainable forest landscape governance. The network is hosted by RECOFTC, in partnership with the Center for International Forestry Research (CIFOR), and in collaboration with universities, research institutes, civil society organizations, local communities, investors and companies in the ASEAN region.

EXPLORE's ultimate goals are to establish a research network for forests and people in Southeast Asia by:

- 1) supporting an inclusive regional forest landscape governance research network;
- 2) providing capacity development to network members; and
- 3) developing and funding small grants that incentivizes multi-disciplinary research with universities and research institutions throughout the region.

EXPLORE will lead to collaborative research and the joint creation of knowledge to improve policies and practices in forest landscape governance. We aim to generate transboundary, regional or multi-country, transformative and multidisciplinary research with policy-makers, civil society, private sector and communities — and share and apply emerging landscape knowledge widely.

The inception workshop aims to introduce the program and to identify existing research gaps, challenges and opportunities. Within specific thematic areas, the workshop will identify and review the extent of collaborative research. Lastly, EXPLORE's Secretariat will present the foundations of the network, introduce the Advisory Committee and explain how future grant schemes will be used to fund the network's research.
